KEEPING THE NEIGHBORHOOD CLEAN

When you are out walking the neighborhood, it sure would be nice if you took a bag with you and picked up litter along the way!

Fall is the summer-lackluster time to repair damaged lawns and prepare for the winter season. Your lawn needs air to grow. Aeration and dethatching loosen up the lawn, promotes deep root growth, and reduces soil compaction that can keep grass from developing roots deep enough to absorb rainwater. Summer's drought leaves many lawns straw-colored and dormant. To help your lawn to recover during and after drought, fertilize it every eight weeks with a slow release fertilizer. A lawn that has the proper nutrients grows dense and deep and will green up faster. Once the lawn is aerated and dethatched, look for weak spots in it.



OVERSEEDING, the spreading of grass seed directly onto soil within an existing lawn can improve a lawn's appearance dramatically and eliminate the need for a total lawn renovation. Early fall is the time to over seed because the warm soil promotes rapid seed growth and typically, fewer weed problems emerge during this time of year. The day before you over seed, be sure to mow the lawn slightly lower than normal and use fertilizer when you seed.
